The SUNY Global Engagement Program in New York City provides students with the opportunity to spend a semester immersed in international affairs in the world's most important global city. Enrolled students do an internship with one of many international organizations along with an integrated class and research program providing a full semester's worth of credits and a truly unique educational experience.

Housed at the SUNY Global Center and co-ordinated by SUNY New Paltz Center for International Programs and the Department of Political Science and International Relations, this program offers options to undertake work and study in many fields related to global affairs including politics, education, the arts, the social and natural sciences, and business. New York City provides vast opportunities to secure an internship at any number of important international not for profit organizations and government offices with international focus including those around the United Nations.



AN INTEGRATED LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The Global Engagement Program includes a unique combination of direct hands-on experience, classroom learning and research, providing students with a strong foundation from which to launch a career in our increasingly interconnected world. The semester-long program, offered every fall, carries a full course load of 12-15 credit hours comprised of three well integrated components:

- an internship in which students work 20-25 hours per week at a relevant international organization: 6-9 credit hours
- a weekly **seminar on international affairs** in which students integrate their internship work experience with classroom learning: 3 credit hours
- a **research colloquium** through which students conduct an original study related to their internship field: 3 credit hours

While students are ultimately responsible for securing their own internship, the Program Director will provide individual assistance to accepted students.
