
WHERE WE ARE

Residence Life

More than 2,800 students live on campus in our 14 residence halls, with 52% of undergraduates living on campus. Our residence life program has been cited for excellence. All new undergraduate students are guaranteed housing.

Eighty-eight percent of our freshmen return for their sophomore year, placing New Paltz in the top 5% nationally among state colleges and universities.

Over 600 Students from more than 50 different countries are enrolled.

This 57,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art Athletic and Wellness Center features an elevated, window-lined 1/9th-mile walking/jogging track, two large workout spaces, an indoor pool, dance/aerobic rooms, handball courts, 2,000-seat gym, and much more.



The Samuel Dorsky Museum of Art, known as The Dorsky on campus, contains six elegant galleries that comprise more than 9,000 square feet of exhibition space making it one of the largest museums in the SUNY system.

English Proficiency

English proficiency scores required for admission to a degree program:

* TOEFL - iBT score of 80 or better

* IELTS - score of 6.5 or better (no sub-scores lower than 6.0)

Conditional Admission

Students applying to undergraduate degree programs at SUNY New Paltz may be admitted without proof of English proficiency if they meet all other admissions standards. Upon arrival, these students will be tested and placed into appropriate academic or English as a Second Language (ESL) courses based on their score. These students will be:

* provided with a letter of conditional admission;

* issued an I-20 from SUNY New Paltz for the ESL program, indicating that the student will be tested for English proficiency upon arrival;

* eligible to enroll in an academic course if they are placed in our advanced levels and meet the required criteria;

* eligible to enter a full-time degree program upon completion of the ESL program or upon achieving the needed proficiency based on TOEFL or IELTS test scores.

Separate application to the Pathways ESL program is not required if applying to a degree program.
